**Debbie Moore Gold Award Scholarship
Application**

The purpose of Girl Scouts Heart of the South's Debbie Moore Gold Award Scholarship is to provide financial assistance through college scholarships to help facilitate the continuation of academic growth for Gold Award Girl Scouts who reflect kindness, consideration and compassion in everything that they do. The scholarship is awarded based on achievement in Girl Scouting, acts of kindness, academics, leadership, and extracurricular activities. A one-time payment of \$500 will be made directly to the recipient's college of choice by the start of their first semester.

DEADLINE for application is March 15.

To be eligible for the scholarship a girl must:

- Be a currently registered Girl Scout with Girl Scouts Heart of the South council
- Be a graduating high school senior
- Be a Gold Award Girl Scout or have received official notification from council she has earned and will receive the Gold Award for the current membership year
- Submit Gold Award Final Report no later than March 15
- Submit two letters of recommendation
- Submit a copy of a letter of acceptance to chosen college or university
- Have at least a 3.0 GPA.
- Submit a copy of high school transcript
- Meet the March 15 deadline for submitting the application
